**3C Keeping Girl Scouting Hip

Take the work out of Junior Badges and Interest Project Patches. You will receive tips for relating Badges & IPs to things that older girls enjoy doing. Discover how to deal with the girls' crazy schedules and varying interest levels. Learn how to do requirements in unique and exciting ways.

Workshop teaches a potpourri of fun, almost-no-cost activities to do with your girls at meetings or in the outdoors. You'll learn gimmicks that will make your girls scream for more.

3E Ceremonies with Pizzazz

Ceremonies play an important part in Girl Scouting. Learn ways to create lasting memories and put Pizzazz into your ceremonies. Leave with ideas to share and get the girls excited about planning their own ceremonies.

4D The 3 R's: Reuse, Repurpose and Recycle (NEW)

Girl Scouts are changing the world one girl at a time. Your girls will be the stewards of our planet in the future, so give them a jump start in living and decorating GREEN

4E Snack Attack
