

Emergency Action Plan Checklist



Safety Activity Checkpoints requires all volunteers to develop an Emergency Action Plan (EAP) before taking girls out on a trip or to an activity. Volunteers can review their troop's Emergency Action Plan with girls as a learning experience for them, to the extent it makes sense according to their age and maturity.
